### **DVA Claims**

DVA continues to operate diligently to provide Services to the Veteran Community, including families. Members are aware that I am a supporter of DVA front line staff who do their utmost to achieve a positive outcome for veterans within the constraints of the three Acts which apply to our Service.

Just a few figures so you understand the hurdles that DVA staff address, there will continue to be a mismatch between the claims lodged & the Determination creating a backlog year on year:





# Malcolm Campbell

Our member, Malcolm Campbell was with the Royal Australian Army Dental Corps in the 33 Dental Unit in South Vietnam and Singapore. His overseas service was from 16/07/1969 to 16/07/1970.

### Malcolm's biography:

I was raised on a sheep farm 20 kms from Glen Innes. Attended the local school then to University of Sydney to study Dentistry. Mid way through the 5 years course I was conscripted. The Army enticed me to finish my degree with a Scholarship for the last 2 years. In my final year I lived at Victoria Barracks. On completion I was posted to Singleton then Vietnam and shortly after that posted to Singapore to the AN-ZUK Military Hospital at Changi for 2 years.

I returned to Singleton and when discharged I established my own surgery in Muswellbrook. I retired 43 years later, built a home in Leura and am now nearly a full time gardener.

### Here is Malcolm's story:

I arrived in Vietnam 18 July 1969. Prior to landing, the Qantas plane flew very low over Saigon (low flying reduces the target time for enemy action) and the background music being played was from the movie Dr Zhivago - Lara's Theme "Some Where My Love".

The Americans had opened the tops of their tents to view the imminent moon landing and to be able to follow the astronauts walk.

My next twelve months were spent providing dental treatment at Vung Tau, Nui Dat and Saigon for the Australian and sometimes American troops. The Dental Corps became very involved in the scheme to WIN THE HEARTS AND MINDS of the South Vietnamese people.

We could travel to the villages with a collapsable dental chair, a fold up table and a bag of instruments. Treatment was extractions only for pain relief. We had no drilling equipment. We would set up in a school yard, town square or other locations. Sometimes travelled to the villages by motor vehicle - other times by helicopter. We would be dropped off and when we heard the helicopter returning, a hurried pack up ensued. The villages would be aware of the dates we would be attending and would be queued up with eager expectation. So Vietnamese ladies wore their best outfit - all very colourful.

When treatment began, people would crowd around to watch - dental extraction is a great spectator sport! More that once I bumped an onlooker with my elbow in the course of removing a tooth. All were very keen and excited. I would give injections to several people and then go back to the first to begin extracting. Often over 100 teeth in a two to three hour session. Many of the teeth were decayed down to the gum line.

Sometimes we would be invited to lunch by the local officials. Always wary of the local ice, so drank coke from the can. Used instruments were sterilised in boiling water - today could not do this as the Aids Virus (which arrived post Vietnam) withstands boiling water temperatures.

From all these experiences I perhaps came to slightly understand the Vietnamese people. Their politeness, gentleness and appreciation, as they tried to express their thanks and despite language barriers, I could fell the depth of their gratitude.

In recent years I have attended Vietnamese functions at the Crystal Palace at Canley Heights, all organised by the ARVN soldiers and Anna Phan.

Recently on 12 January 2024 I attended a fundraising dinner at the same venue - it's aim was to unify the Vietnamese Community (past Vietnam Veterans and the younger Australian born Vietnamese Community). 610 people attended, many had been educated in Australia and leading professional lives.

I was seated between a Vietnamese doctor and a pharmacist (both women educated in Australia). We had a wonderful discussion about my time in Vietnam. The pharmacist grew up next to the Australian Embassy in Saigon and could remember hearing accounts from her parents and grand parents, of dental happenings by the Australian Army.

From my previous visits to Canley Heights, several people came and welcomed me back. All very friendly.

*The people all miss Vietnam but value the opportunities Australia has given them. They are now proud to be <u>Australian</u>.*
